

Abstract submission guidelines AquaConSoil 2025

General terms & conditions

1. The Programme Committee (PC) will review the abstracts. The PC can only review complete forms. The PC may suggest changing the form of the submission, e.g. from oral presentation to poster presentation. In case this applies to you, it will be communicated after the reviewing process.
2. The presenting author(s) of an accepted abstract must register and attend the congress.
3. Abstracts may only be submitted via the AquaConSoil submission tool. Abstracts submitted by e-mail will not be accepted.
4. Submitted documents should be GDPR compliant. For example, in the documents, no contact details are allowed (this involves addresses and e-mail details).
5. Abstracts should be submitted before the deadline of **6 December 2024**.

Authors of accepted abstracts (all presentations and posters) will be invited to submit a paper for the conference proceedings.

Submission details

1. Authors should indicate their presentation type preference. There are 3 types of submissions:
 - a. **Oral presentation**
 - An oral presentation lasts 10 min + 5 min of discussion, in a thematic session; these thematic sessions consist of 5 presentations and a short discussion at the end of the session.
 - b. **Poster presentation**
 - Poster will be on display during all conference days.
 - At the conference there will be an opportunity for flash presentation (5 min presentation of your poster) If you are interested, please indicate this in the abstract submission tool.
 - c. **Interactive session (60-90 min)**
 - The layout of this session is flexible, but should be different from the layout of regular thematic sessions. These sessions are focused to be a more

interactive format. An example could be a workshop, which allows for more discussion than the regular sessions.

- Depending on content and format, the session can be assigned to either a 60 or 90 minutes timeslot.
2. The same person may serve as presenting author for an oral presentation for a maximum of 1 abstract. If more abstracts with the same presenting author are submitted, the Programme Committee will choose only 1.
 3. The same person may serve as presenting author for a poster presentation for a maximum of 1 abstract. If more abstracts with the same presenting author are submitted, the Programme Committee will choose only 1.

Abstract details

1. Abstracts should be written in English.
2. Your abstract should be max. 600 words with a title of max. 25 words.
3. Abstracts for oral presentations and posters should include:
 - Purpose of study
 - Methodology
 - Summary of findings/results
 - Conclusion/take home message
 - Significance / contributions of study
 - *Optional:*
 - Supporting figure
 - Graphical abstract: a concise, visual summary of the main findings or concepts of a scientific paper, typically combining images, diagrams, and minimal text to quickly convey the essence of the research.
4. Abstracts for interactive sessions should include:
 - A short summary of what you intend to do/present during the session
 - List of presenters
 - Significance
 - Please point out in your abstract in what way you intend to interact with the public (e.g. roundtables, discussion rounds, brainstorm with flip-overs, etc.)
 - Please also provide a short list of required equipment and maximum number of attendees (if applicable)
 - *Optional:*
 - Supporting figure
5. On the abstract, no contact details are allowed (this involves addresses and e-mail details).
